The Bioko Island Malaria Control Project (BIMCP) III is a five-year project, funded by Marathon Oil Corporation, which seeks to substantially reduce morbidity and mortality caused by malaria on Bioko Island, Equatorial Guinea.

The M&EO is responsible for overseeing and managing the BIMCP monitoring and evaluation component in collaboration with the HIS Officer, the GIS Officer and the Medical Entomology Officer. He/She will also coordinate BIMCP's M&E information systems and facilitate the production of key performance indicators, the analysis of data for decision-making, and training of national staff from the Project and the Ministry of Health and Social Welfare/National Malaria Control Program on the use of this data for decision-making. The M&EO reports directly to the MCDI Country Director, and through him to the Project Manager, and the Director of the International Division.

Qualifications, Skills and Experiences:

- Monitoring and Evaluation Professional with health program M&E work experience in developing countries; graduate degree in Epidemiology, Bio-Statistics, Statistics, Monitoring and Evaluation and/or Public Health desirable.
- Extensive experience in data processing and database management (from data capturing to data analysis for decision-making). This should include high level knowledge in the use of database management software (e.g. preferably, MS Access, SQL-Server and/or other), SQL, MS Excel, and data analysis software (e.g. STATA, SPSS, EPI Info, and/or other). Experience in the use / programming of PDAs will be considered an asset.
- Experience in managing and/or working with information systems in at least one of the following areas: health information, drug supplies management, and/or Indoor Residual Spraying or other disease control intervention services.
- Established track record in monitoring and evaluation of health programs, preferably malaria control or other infectious diseases, in a developing country setting.

- Experience in implementing / managing households surveys (preferably malaria indicator surveys), including training and supervision of enumerators, processing and cleaning of data, merging datasets, and basic data analysis.
- Experience in teaching monitoring and evaluation, database management, data analysis using the software identified above.
- Good interpersonal skills, team player, able to work under stress. Sensitivity to the concerns of the developing world and able to work with local and national authorities and community-based providers from different cultural backgrounds.
- Experience with data analysis, technical report writing, and preparing scientific publications. Experience in producing articles for peer-reviewed journals.
- Must be fluent oral and written Spanish, good knowledge of English; knowledge of French would be an additional asset.
